Section 1 – Introduction

This Statement of Environmental Particulars indicates how environmental considerations and the views of interested parties (consultees) were taken into account during the preparation of the second Shoreline Management Plan (SMP) for The Wash. It explains how the Environment Agency and their partners (local authorities, Natural England, English Heritage and other organisations) selected the preferred options within the plan. This statement goes on to set out the monitoring procedures that have been set in place to monitor the significant environmental effects of implementing the plan.

This statement also includes a detailed account of how the historic environment has been considered within the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) in response to dialogue with Norfolk Landscape Archaeology and English Heritage (see Appendix 1).

Purpose of this SEA Statement of Environmental Particulars

This Statement of Environmental Particulars is a requirement under the Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004. It sets out how the findings of the SEA have been taken into account and how views expressed during the consultation period have been considered as The Wash SMP2 has been finalised.

Section 2 – Background

The Wash Shoreline Management Plan 2

A SMP is a large-scale assessment of the risks associated with coastal processes and aims to reduce the risks to the social, economic, natural and historical environment through effective and sustainable shoreline management.

The SMP for The Wash addressed these issues in the context of its location, covering the largest estuarine system in the UK. The Wash SMP covers approximately 105 km of coastline, stretching from Gibraltar Point to Old Hunstanton. As well as the large-scale subtidal and intertidal habitats, The Wash has a number of valuable fringing habitats of conservation significance. These are characterised by saline lagoons, low-lying marshes, shingle beaches, dune complexes and farmland. The environmental values of The Wash are reflected in the numerous national and international nature conservation and other designations covering the area.

More land has been reclaimed from The Wash than any other British estuary, with large amounts of swamp and marshland having been reclaimed through

drainage and embankment that began in Roman times. The Wash also contains some of the most productive farmland in the country with over 31,000 hectares (ha) of Grade 1 agricultural land. It is estimated that the production of food in the area is worth in the region of £250 million, which contributes significantly to the regional economy.

The Wash SMP is based on a division of the coast into four Policy Development Zones (PDZ), with supporting policy for each PDZ provided for three time periods (epochs). Epoch 1 covers the period from the present day to 2025, epoch 2 from 2025 to 2055 and epoch 3 from 2055 to 2105.

Strategic Environmental Assessment

In order to ensure environmental considerations were integrated throughout the development of the SMP, a non-statutory SEA was undertaken following the requirements of the SEA Regulations (The SEA Directive 2001/42/EC is transposed into United Kingdom law by the Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004) and the Environment Agency's internal SEA procedure. This assessment seeks to ensure that any potentially significant effects of the SMP on the environment are considered throughout its development.

Within the SEA process, and in a manner analogous to that used throughout the SMP process, the term 'environment' has been used to cover the following receptors (as defined in Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations, SI 1633 2004):

- Population and communities (including human health, critical infrastructure, etc.);
- Cultural heritage, including architectural and archaeological heritage;
- Material assets;
- Biodiversity, fauna and flora;
- Soil;
- Water;
- Air;
- Climatic factors; and
- Landscape.

The SEA process for The Wash SMP has included: a Scoping Report; an Environmental Report (Appendix K of the draft SMP2, August 2009) and an Addendum to the Environmental Report (March 2010).

The requirement for an addendum stemmed from discussions with Natural England and the Environment Agency (after the provision of the Environmental Report) which sought to ensure that the assessment of the SMP under the

Habitats Regulations (The Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2010) accounted for the uncertainties inherent within a long term strategic plan. This meant that the Habitats Regulations Assessment (HRA) (also known as the Appropriate Assessment) was finalised after the SEA Environmental Report was published. The Addendum provided an up-to-date account of the assessment tables where they related to matters influenced by the HRA and incorporated a consideration of the results of an assessment in accordance with the requirements of the Water Framework Directive (Council Directive 2000/60/EC establishing a framework for Community action in the field of water policy). In addition, the Addendum addressed specific points which were raised through the consultation exercise on the draft SMP. This concerns:

- The manner in which the consultation process has driven the SMP process and the SEA;
- An enhanced account of how geology and hydrology have been considered within the SEA;
- An expanded account of how effects of the SMP, and their significance, has been determined;
- A clear expression of how potential cumulative effects with other plans and projects has been assessed; and
- A detailed account of the mitigation and monitoring measures required to support the SEA.

The Post adoption statement will provide details of how to view and obtain copies of these documents.

Section 3 - Alternatives

This section sets out the reasons for selecting the preferred policy option for each PDZ (across all three epochs) in the light of other reasonable alternatives. Policy options available under the SMP are outlined in **Table 3.1**.

Table 3.1 Options used in SMP development

SMP option	Description of option
Hold the line (HTL)	Hold the existing defence line by maintaining or changing the standard of protection. This policy will cover those situations where work or operations are carried out in front of the existing defences (such as beach recharge, rebuilding the toe of a structure, building offshore breakwaters and so on), to improve or maintain the standard of protection provided by the existing defence line. This policy also includes other policies that involve operations to the back of existing defences (such as building secondary floodwalls) where they form an essential part of maintaining the current coastal defence system.

SMP option	Description of option
Advance the line (ATL)	Advance the existing defence line by building new defences on the seaward side of the original defences. Using this policy should be limited to those policy units where significant land reclamation is considered.
Managed realignment (MR)	Managed realignment by allowing the shoreline to move backwards or forwards, with management to control or limit movement (such as reducing erosion or building new defences on the landward side of the original defences).
No active intervention (NAI)	No active intervention, where there is no investment in coastal defences or operations.

When considered in relation to the PDZs, policy options were ruled out immediately if they were not applicable or if it was obvious that there were no clear drivers but significant constraints. This was the case for Advance the Line policies. Additionally, in PDZ 3 only one policy was considered realistic as all others would result in the loss of Hunstanton. The policies selected and the alternative options considered (where these were available) are presented below (**Table 3.2**). For a detailed consideration of how SMP options were evaluated, please see Appendix 1a of the Addendum to the SEA Environmental Report (March 2010) and Appendix G of the SMP – Policy Appraisal. Section 2.5 of the addendum explains how the significance of the effects was determined.

PDZ 2 (epoch 1 to 3) Wolferton Creek to South Hunstanton

Section 4 – Integration of Environmental Considerations

The decision to provide a stand alone SEA for The Wash SMP was taken after the commencement of the SMP process. Up to that point, SMPs had been accompanied by an SEA signposting exercise. This highlighted those elements of the SMP which addressed the requirements of the SEA Regulations. Accordingly, the use of the SEA in the development, refinement and selection of policy was limited in the context of The Wash SMP. Nevertheless, the SMP followed the Defra SMP Guidelines (Defra, 2006) which are intended to ensure that a consideration of environmental, social and economic factors is central to the development of policy options. A detailed account of how environmental issues have shaped the development of policy in The Wash SMP is provided in Appendix G of the SMP – Policy Appraisal. Further to the Policy Appraisal process within the SMP, the subsequent assessment of preferred policy options provided in the SEA Environmental Report (and Addendum) confirmed that a balanced approach was taken to select policy which has the most beneficial outcomes for the environment (across the range of receptors specified) (See Section 2).

The SEA process has developed two distinct documents: a Scoping Report; and an Environmental Report and Addendum. These are described below.

The Scoping Report (April 2009)

The Scoping Report established an environmental baseline for the coastline of The Wash and in doing so informed the development of a series of SEA assessment criteria by which SMP policies could be assessed. The suite of environmental concerns considered is as follows:

- Threats from tidal inundation to approximately ten percent of the nation's high quality agricultural land;
- Protection of vulnerable, low lying coastal communities and the socio-economic features and issues which support them in regard to the effects of sea level rise;
- The loss of designated intertidal habitat located seaward of existing defences due to sea level rise;
- Threat to biodiversity due to sea level rise and the interactions between various coastal habitat types;
- Maintenance of environmental conditions to support biodiversity and quality of life; and
- Potential threats to low lying historic and archaeological features located behind current defences, in areas adjacent to early defences and the loss of the record this provides of settlement in The Wash.

The Environmental Report (August 2009) and Addendum (March 2010)

Following the completion of the Scoping Report (and accompanying consultation period) the preferred policy options for The Wash SMP were assessed within the Environmental Report. The Environmental Report was then supplemented by an Addendum as previously detailed in Section 2. On the basis of the assessment provided in the SEA Environmental Report and the Addendum, The Wash SMP was considered to have been successful in providing a balance of considering the range of environmental values and only two major negative impacts were identified. Although there were minor negative impacts, the majority of the remaining impacts are considered to be either minor positive or neutral.

In general, the negative impacts of the SMP related to:

- 1) Where a HTL policy was pursued, which would not work with natural coastal processes (coastal processes being important for a range of habitats and species); and
- 2) Where a MR policy was pursued, which would lead to the loss of agricultural land or community assets (such as access roads to the foreshore).

In both these instances, negative impacts were anticipated due to the effects of policies which were selected in order to maintain wider environmental values. For example, a HTL policy maintains coastal communities and agricultural land, while a MR policy provides compensatory habitat for intertidal habitat projected to be lost due to anticipated sea level rise. The negative impacts are therefore the product of a policy which provides a wider, more extensive range of positive environmental impacts – this is detailed within the Environmental Report and the supporting Addendum.

The SMP can therefore be concluded to have provided a range of positive benefits to the environment and where negative impacts have been identified, monitoring has been devised to assess these impacts and determine necessary mitigation (as outlined in Section 7).

Table 4.1 summarises the SEA assessment tables. In situations where the SEA criteria has included assessment of two or more SEA indicators the most negative effect has been shown. For PDZ 1 the policies for epochs 2 and 3 are conditional and an assessment of both options has been shown. The table is colour-coded, as in previous documents, according to the legend below.

Section 5 – Influence of the Environmental Report

As described previously, the SMP was progressed in advance of the SEA and as such it cannot be demonstrated that the SEA influenced the development of SMP policy. However, the consideration of environmental factors has played a crucial role in the development of the SMP, as documented in Appendix G of the SMP – Policy Appraisal. The consideration of environmental factors in the development of the SMP was based on adherence to SMP guidance, which has previously been considered sufficient to attend the requirements of the SEA Regulations. The environmental elements of the SMP process (such as the Theme Review and Policy Appraisal) had full regard to how the policy may affect the environment. This process informed the development of the SMP. Although the Environmental Report and Addendum followed this process, they confirm that it achieved its intentions.

The Environmental Report and Addendum confirmed that The Wash SMP provides a wide range of positive environmental benefits, through the maintenance of key coastal settlements, defence of agricultural land, management of coastal habitat and protection of the coastal landscape. The consideration of environmental issues can therefore be shown to have influenced SMP policy development.

The provision of a potential MR policy for PDZ1 in epoch 2 has the sole driver of seeking compliance with the Habitats Regulations. The use of a conditional policy reflects the intent to maintain (through a HTL policy) the range of environmental values that exist landward of defences in PDZ1, unless the requirement for realignment due to coastal squeeze is anticipated (based on monitoring). Such a requirement would stem from the loss of intertidal habitat designated under the Habitats Regulations, should it be shown that The Wash has entered an erosional state. In PDZ2 and PDZ3, the HTL policy is provided to maintain environmental values. Negative impacts are confined to preventing the natural development of the coastline or to maintaining coastal processes. PDZ4 provides for the unconstrained development of the cliff system, which enables the cliff to erode naturally and to maintain the geological and ecological values of this area.

PDZ4 does contain a historic lighthouse, which may be under threat through the pursuit of any policy which does not hold the line (the preferred policy is NAI). Whilst this factor was considered, it did not influence policy to the extent that a HTL policy was pursued. English Heritage did not suggest that such a course of action was required, but instead it was agreed that recognition of this impact would be included in the appraisal and narrative. This was one of the reasons to include an action to improve our understanding of the positive and negative aspects of NAI on the cliffs, in preparation for SMP3.

The mitigation and monitoring required based on the conclusions of the Environmental Report and Addendum and policy appraisal is discussed in Section 7. It should be noted that further assessment of environmental impacts and Habitat Regulation Assessments will be carried out at strategy and scheme level, and the monitoring and mitigation requirements will be reviewed as part of the development of shoreline management plan 3 (SMP3).

Section 6 – Consultation

The Scoping Report underwent a four week consultation period with The Wash SMP CSG from 13 January until 10 February 2009. **Table 6.1** outlines the consultation responses at this stage and sets out how these have influenced the assessment. Following the consultation period and the provision of feedback by the statutory consultees, the environmental assessment of preferred SMP policy was undertaken using the SEA assessment criteria agreed through the consultation period.

The Environmental Report underwent a 3 month public consultation period, from 12 October 2009 until 15 January 2010, as part of the public consultation for the Draft SMP for The Wash. **Table 6.2** outlines the consultation responses and subsequent actions.

The Addendum to the Environmental Report underwent a 3 week consultation period, from 1 to 22 April 2010. **Table 6.3** outlines the consultation responses and subsequent actions.

The overall SMP's consultation and stakeholder engagement is described in the SMP (Environment Agency, 2010: Appendix B - Stakeholder Engagement).

Within the course of developing the SMP2, consideration was given to the wording which accompanied the policy for PDZ1 in epoch 2. Discussions related to the degree of certainty associated with the selection of managed realignment in the event of an erosional scenario. The actual policy remained consistent throughout this process, and the supporting text for policy is not considered to have any effect on the SEA. The text clarifies that in the event of an erosional scenario in PDZ1 in epoch 2, realignment would be provided assuming that legislative drivers remained for the pursuit of such a policy.

In response to final comments received from the SMP Quality Review Group, two points require clarification/confirmation.

- It is acknowledged that conservation objectives form Natural England’s (NE) statutory advice to operators and to competent authorities and are used as the baseline against which to evaluate possible damaging operations. They set out the detailed habitat and environmental conditions necessary to maintain favourable conservation status and site integrity. This has informed assessment of impacts of the SMP on designated sites.
- The value of hydrological and geological concerns have been fully considered through the SEA process. Although not specifically identified as SEA receptors (since these are defined in the SEA Regulations as shown in Section 2) it is considered that the Water Framework Directive assessment, and SEA criteria applied, ensure that the impact on SMP policy on these issues is considered appropriately.

The SEA did not identify any significant environmental effects that required transboundary consultation on this plan. Due to this no consultation responses were received via this consultation route.

Consultation Relating to the Historic Environment

As a result of consultation comments on the SEA ER from English Heritage and Norfolk Landscape Archaeology, a fuller consideration of the historic environment has been undertaken to expand the baseline provided in the original ER. An account of how the historic environment has been considered is now complete and is provided below.

The historic environment baseline for PDZ1 was extensively informed by the Rapid Coastal Zone Assessment (RCZA³) and survey, which reported on all sites and features within PDZ1. This element of the historic environment baseline and assessment was considered appropriate by the consultees.

In order to further inform the baseline and assessment of the historic environment for the eastern end of PDZ1, and PDZs 2, 3, and 4 further data was collected and collated from the Historic Environment Record (HER) maintained by Norfolk Landscape Archaeology. Norfolk Landscape Archaeology also provided the digital Historic Landscape Characterisation data for the study area. In addition, the records of Scheduled Monuments, Listed Buildings and Historic Parks and Gardens were also obtained from English Heritage to ensure that the records were up to date.

Following data collection, the historic environment data was included into the SMP Geographic Information System (GIS) database and the information on designated and non-designated sites and historic landscape character, were extracted on an individual PDZ basis. Using this data, the SMP Theme Review (The Wash SMP2, Appendix D) was updated, which entailed input from Norfolk Landscape Archaeology and English Heritage to identify:

- The issues associated with all the historic environment features;
- Whether they would affect policy;
- The benefits associated with each feature;
- The scale (or value) of each feature;
- The beneficiaries for each feature;
- What could affect the value of each feature; and
- The objective for each feature.

³ The RCZA aims to establish a more comprehensive and reliable database assessment of the range and scope of the archaeological resource than is currently available. Not only should this lead to a significant improvement in the archaeological coverage within the various Local Authority HERs, but it is also intended to inform long-term strategies for the management of the cultural heritage resource, especially in the light of the current SMPs. The results have been published in the form of a series of reports, arranged by coastal section, and supported by maps showing distributions of sites. A digital archive is also available, including a GIS-based record of the NMP data (Norfolk Archaeological Unit, 2005 and Humber Field Archaeology, 2007).

Norfolk Landscape Archaeology and English Heritage were then consulted on the final version of the Theme Review tables, which was used to update the SMP Theme Review.

The data presented in the Theme Review were then combined with data extracted from the GIS tool, which identified the historic environment features which were likely to fall within either the erosion lines or flood zone for each epoch. Using this, coupled with an indication of where a MR policy was the preferred option, the policies of the SMP were appraised and assessed against the historic environment resource. Where significant historic environment features were identified as being at risk as a result of SMP policy, the assessment results and their potential impact on policy appraisal were discussed with the EA and partner authorities. On completion, an assessment was carried out. This assessment is included at **Appendix 1**, and details the work undertaken and the relevant findings. Where relevant, mitigation measures or recommendations for survey and recording are provided.

The updated work identified that the preferred policies could result in the disturbance of around twenty-five non-designated historic environment sites and had the potential to affect the setting of a Conservation Area, if mitigation was not undertaken. Furthermore, as a result of erosion due to NAI policies, eighty-two historic environment sites or features had the potential to be affected, including designated sites (two Listed Buildings, part of a Conservation Area), and six regionally important sites that were not designated.

Section 7 – Environmental Monitoring Measures for the Implementation of this Project

The Wash SMP is primarily based on the principle of holding the existing line (HTL). In PDZ1 MR may be required to provide compensation for habitat lost due to projected sea level rise and an NAI approach is adopted in PDZ4. Schemes to implement the SMP will be confined to potential managed realignments (if required).

Management approaches in PDZ2 will be established through a separate process once an approach to the management of Snettisham lagoons has been established, based on gaining further understanding of the impacts of coastal processes on habitats seaward of the defence line and on the behaviour of the shingle ridge. The SMP Action Plan (Chapter 5 of the main SMP document) specifies the need for a collaborative approach to management, which will need to be established in a management agreement.

Monitoring for the SMP2 will primarily include:

- Monitoring the response of The Wash, to establish whether the system will either accrete or erode in response to sea level rise; and
- Monitoring the rate of erosion of Hunstanton Cliffs to ensure that the houses at the cliff tops are not threatened due to unforeseen levels of erosion.

The SMP Action Plan provides for both these actions. Monitoring of landward receptors may be required if a MR policy is adopted for PDZ1. More detailed assessments will also be carried out at both the Coastal Strategy and scheme level – for instance realignment schemes will be supported by the environmental impact assessment process. These will include HRA and other assessments to determine and mitigate environmental impacts, which will be informed by the knowledge and information developed through the monitoring programme.

With respect to the historic environment resource, Appendix 1 to this document provides a listing of features that would be at risk of erosion throughout the lifetime of the SMP and recommendations for surveying these sites.

The monitoring requirements of the SEA Environmental Report, the Addendum, and the historic environment addendum (Appendix 1) are provided for by the SMP Action Plan.

Effects on the integrity of international sites

Due to the options based approach to epoch 2 and 3, there will be a need to ensure that the manner in which intertidal habitat responds to the epoch 1 HTL policy and the projected rise in sea level is monitored and assessed. The consideration of the extent of intertidal habitat and the ratio of mudflat to saltmarsh will therefore require ongoing consideration (which is linked to the monitoring of United Kingdom Biodiversity Action Plan (UKBAP) habitat – see below).

The Action Plan provides a specific programme of monitoring and evaluation to determine in detail the response of the system to SMP policy and to sea level rise. Actions are provided for each PDZ and epoch; however, the approach specified is as follows (i.e. this text is repeated for each PDZ):

Action – a study to reduce the uncertainty with respect to the predictions of saltmarsh / mudflat development and to enable predictions of saltmarsh and mudflat loss / gain to be more accurate. This will be informed by monitoring

Action – continue / increase monitoring of saltmarsh and mudflat areas. This needs to inform understanding of the intertidal areas' flood defence function, the

sustainability of the earth embankments and its habitat function. To be integrated with Strategic Regional Shoreline Monitoring Programme. This programme should also aim to collate information relating to dredging (locations, timings, volumes, etc.) within The Wash.

Effects on condition of SSSIs

The SMP has the potential to affect the condition of SSSIs through changes in habitat and coastal management (due to the number of SSSIs on the coast), with knock-on effects on the high level targets relating to SSSIs in favourable condition. A key tool, therefore, in managing and monitoring change on The Wash is the continued monitoring of SSSI units, which enables an early determination of where favourable condition may be threatened by inappropriate coastal management (SMP policy). It is considered that the existing monitoring programme undertaken by Natural England would be sufficient for this purpose, but there is a need to feed any initial findings into the SMP Action Plan and the development of subsequent SMP policy at the earliest stage.

The actions provided for monitoring in the Action Plan, coupled with the monitoring programmes established by Natural England and the Environment Agency will ensure that impacts on SSSIs are considered and serve to inform the development of future SMP policy.

Effects on UKBAP habitat

One of the main effects of SMP policy will be the shift in transitional habitat composition (particularly the loss or gain of intertidal habitat and the relative ratios of mudflat to saltmarsh). The actual effect will be dependent on the selection of policy for epochs 2 and 3. There is a need, therefore, to ensure that existing monitoring of UKBAP habitat in the plan area is provided in a manner which will highlight shifts in UKBAP habitat extent and informs the UKBAP recording process. This mechanism is required to ensure that wider mechanisms exist for UKBAP habitat creation which addresses emerging requirements based on the effects of the SMP.

The actions provided for monitoring in the Action Plan, coupled with Natural England and the Environment Agency's monitoring programmes will ensure that impacts on UKBAP habitat are considered and inform the development of future SMP policy.

Effects on coastal cultural and archaeological sites

The updated work identified that the preferred policies could result in the disturbance of around twenty-five non-designated historic environment sites, in addition to potentially affect the setting of a Conservation Area, if mitigation was not employed.

As a result of erosion due to the proposed policies, fifty-six historic environment sites or features could be affected, including two Listed Buildings, part of a

Conservation Area (not included in the site numbers), and one nationally and three regionally important site that are not designated. The remaining forty-nine sites are non-designated.

In addition, it must be accepted that other 'unknown' sites could be at risk, but would only come to light as the SMP is implemented and the coastline erodes. Within the SMP Action Plan therefore, English Heritage will be instrumental in establishing what the specific nature of losses may be and where losses are known, a figure for investigation established so that this funding can be sought from Government. The intent of addressing this matter within the SMP Action Plan will be to ensure that English Heritage is provided with the necessary funds, in advance to investigating sites at risk. This element of work would tie in with the monitoring and survey recommendations for the historic environment and provide a framework for flexible and rapid response to the discovery of sites or features of importance that become exposed as a result of coastal erosion.

The HTL policies implemented by the SMP will maintain the protection from erosion for heritage assets and maintain the current level of flood protection, benefiting 249 locally important, 11 regionally important, and 126 nationally important non-designated heritage assets, as well as 25 Listed Buildings, 5 Scheduled Monuments, and 3 Conservation Areas.

Appendix 1 – Historic Environment Addendum

Introduction

This addendum addresses gaps in the historic environment assessment identified by English Heritage and Norfolk Landscape Archaeology (NLA) as necessary to enable an appropriate level of baseline and assessment for the Wash SMP2 Review. The gaps identified were incomplete identification of HER sites, Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas.

This addendum focuses on the provision of historic environment baseline data for the Norfolk side of the Wash SMP area, as well as inclusion of all listed buildings within the whole Wash study area. The Lincolnshire Rapid Coastal Zone Assessment and Survey (RCZAS) was completed during the early stages of the SMP review. That document provided sufficient baseline information and assessment and was incorporated within the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA). This approach avoids any repetition in relation to the historic environment on the Lincolnshire side of the study area.

Historic Environment Baseline

The Wash coastline has evolved over many thousands of years, especially since the end of the last glaciation, as ice sheets retreated and sea level rose. Over time, areas which were previously land during earlier historic and prehistoric periods have become inundated. However, significant drainage channels and flood embankments have also been constructed over time. The greatest period of management was that designed by Vermuyden in the 17th Century, though some of the earliest examples occur inland, and date to the Saxon period. The prevention of tidal inundation has turned what were formerly large expanses of fen and reedbeds into some of the largest areas of productive agricultural land in the UK. However, as a consequence of sea level rise and subsequent increased or continued erosion, many sites and finds providing evidence of early settlement and activity are either at risk of erosion or could experience increased flooding due to extreme tidal events.

The Wash coastline and intertidal zones have been researched by archaeologists for many years, resulting in a large amount of information on sites and finds. The baseline for the Lincolnshire side of the study area was extensively informed by the RCZAS, which reported on all sites and features within the majority of Policy Development Zone (PDZ) 1 of the SMP study area. However, further data have been collected and collated for the Norfolk side of the SMP study area; this covers the eastern end of PDZ1, and PDZs 2, 3, and 4. These data are based on the Historic Environment Record (HER), provided to Royal Haskoning by NLA for the search areas shown in Figure 1. Records of Scheduled Monuments (SMs), Listed Buildings, and Historic Parks

and Gardens from datasets provided by English Heritage have also been reviewed.

The coastal historic environment for the Norfolk side of the Wash SMP study area comprises a wide range of sites, structures and landscapes. These include:

- Mesolithic and Neolithic flint finds, that are also linked to multiperiod sites;
- Bronze Age finds including barrows;
- Scattered Iron Age finds, enclosures and settlements;
- Roman settlements linked to Late Iron Age settlement, along with numerous scatters of Roman finds (coins, jewellery, and pottery), as well as salterns and metalworking sites;
- A small number of Saxon finds and infrequent evidence of salt production, and implied settlements (identified by cemetery sites);
- Medieval settlements and ports (e.g. Maindenhouse, Wolferton), and numerous salterns indicating saltmaking, oyster beds, along with a large number of finds (including pottery, coins, and a cauldron), these include two listed buildings (a cross and St Margarets Church);
- Post-medieval settlements such as Terrington St Clement, Clenchwarton, West Lynn, the Port and town of King's Lynn, South Wootton, North Wootton, Castle Rising, Wolferton, Dersingham, Ingoldisthorpe, Snettisham, Heacham, and Hunstanton, many of which contain preserved structures that are Listed. However, along the coastal strip there are large numbers of post-medieval sea defences; and
- A large number of structures relating to World War II defences.


Designated Sites and Monuments

Only a very small proportion of recognised and recorded historic assets (less than 5%) receive statutory protection and many more archaeological sites, perhaps the majority, remain undiscovered. Designated sites include:

- **Scheduled Monuments** (SMs) designated under the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979;
- **Historic shipwrecks** designated under the Protection of Wrecks Act 1973; and
- **Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas** designated under the terms of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (listed buildings are graded I, II*, or II).

Other historic sites that need to be considered include Historic Parks and Gardens.

Scheduled Monuments

A SM is a man-made structure of national importance that receives legal protection under the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

There are 20 SMs in the SMP search area, although only 5 fall within the flood zone and none are immediately adjacent to the coast. The SMs could be at risk of flooding, erosion, managed realignment policies or be in the vicinity or locations of coastal management measures that could result in disturbance, deterioration, or changes to their setting. The SMs within the flood zone are presented in **Figure 2** and **Figure 3**, and include:

Protected Wrecks

Protected Wrecks are protected by UK legislation which includes: the Protection of Wrecks Act 1973; Protection of Military Remains Act 1986; and the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979. There are no protected wrecks in or near to the SMP study area.

Listed Buildings

Buildings that have been recognised for their special architectural or historic interest can be 'listed', and have legal protection under "The Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990". This results in the need to obtain listed building consent for works of demolition, alteration or extension which affect its character as a building of special architectural or historic interest. Listed buildings are of national interest. There are 204 Listed Buildings identified within the SMP study area. Of these, 74 Listed Buildings (3 are Grade I, 10 are Grade II*, and 61 are Grade II) are located within the coastal zone and flood zone. These structures could be at risk of flooding, erosion, managed realignment policies or be in the vicinity or locations of coastal management measures that could result in disturbance, deterioration, or changes to their setting. The listed buildings in the SMP Study Area are presented on **Figures 2 to 4** and are listed in **Annex A1** the list below identifies those that are potentially at risk from coastal flooding and erosion.

Conservation Areas

Local Planning Authorities have a duty under The Planning (Listed Buildings & Conservation Areas) Act 1990 to designate as conservation areas any areas considered to be of special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to protect or enhance. There are 9 Conservation Areas within the SMP Study Area as listed below, and shown on **Figures 2 to 4**. Those in **bold** in the table below are at risk from either erosion or extreme coastal flooding.

Historic Parks and Gardens

There are 3 Historic Parks and Gardens (designated under Section 8C of the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953 (inserted by section 33 of, and paragraph 10 of Section 4, to the National Heritage Act 1983)) located within the SMP study area, as follows:

- Sandringham (Grade II*);
- Hunstanton Hall (Grade II); and
- The Walks, King's Lynn (Grade II).

Non-Designated Sites and Historic Landscape Character

As mentioned earlier there is a wide variety of non-designated sites, finds and features recorded in the Norfolk (and Lincolnshire HERs). These may be of local, regional and some may even be of national significance. Data within this addendum have been drawn from the Norfolk HER. Over 1100 records were received from the Norfolk HER and other datasets, as presented in **Annex A1** and shown on **Figures 2 to 4**. These data were collated and those sites situated within the areas at risk from long term erosion (based on the SMP erosion lines) or flooding (based on flood risk outlines) were extracted to form the gazetteer of sites to be examined against SMP policies. **Annex A3** presents the gazetteer of sites at risk of the related SMP effects, together with the SMP PDZ within which they are located and the potential risks to each record (such as flooding, erosion, a combination of these, or in some cases no risk except from possible coastal management measures). As some sites may be at risk from a number of threats, these records will be repeated in one or more units. Consequently, the total number of records/sites (502) presented in the gazetteer actually represents 462 recorded sites and monuments within the Norfolk area of the Wash SMP.

Because of the nature of site and find designation and recording, the list of sites and finds at risk was reviewed and a determination of importance undertaken alongside confirmation and review by NLA for the Norfolk section. A similar exercise was carried within the RCZAS for the Lincolnshire part of the SMP area, prior to the development of the SMP review. These reviews identified whether there were any specific sites that were not designated but which could be of greater value than their presence on the HER indicates. A number of sites were identified as being of significant national or international importance. The indication of site importance is present within **Annex A3**.

Key Risks to Historic Environment Assets in relation to Coastal Management

Archaeological sites and finds are at risk from a number of activities that are linked to or that could arise from the policies of coastal management and the SMP itself. The following impacts could therefore arise and are therefore considered within the assessment of the effects of the SMP on the historic environment:

- Erosion resulting in the disturbance, deterioration, and eventual damage and destruction of sites, finds and features (including peat deposits);
- Flooding leading to deterioration of sites and finds, in particular buildings;
- Tidal inundation leading to the alteration of the preservation environment of buried sites, finds and features;
- Coastal management measures resulting in the physical disturbance to sites, finds and features;
- Coastal management measures leading to the alteration of the historic landscape; and
- Coastal management measures leading to the alteration of the visual setting of important designated structures including SMs, Listed Buildings, and Conservation Areas.

The latter two potential risks identified above relate to the potential impact of natural coastal processes or coastal management measures on the visual setting of monuments and structures, or disturbance to the historic landscape character of a given area. Consequently, HLC data was provided by NLA and included in the SEA dataset; however, given the volume of the data it has not been presented on maps. Similar work has not been carried out on HLC data from the Lincolnshire part of the SMP area. Key character areas and sites are the SMs, Listed Buildings, and Conservation Areas. Additional important HLC features include:

- Parliamentary fen enclosure with features such as boundaries removed by modern agricultural activities in the western (PDZ1) study area;
- Enclosure and drainage of the fens from during the 19th and 20th Century characterises the shore; and
- 18th Century enclosure and woodland plantations with occasional medieval and post-medieval settlements (such as Castle Rising, Wolferton, Snettisham, Heacham and Hunstanton).

King's Lynn is a town of medieval origin that has functioned as a port for centuries. It contains a large number of historic buildings, many situated within its Conservation Area, as well as a Registered Historic Parks and Gardens. Key designated landscape features within the SMP study area are:

- the Conservation Area and Listed Buildings in Terrington St Clement;
- the Church and Cross in Clenchwarton which are Listed and Scheduled;

- the collection of Listed Buildings in North Wootton and South Wootton;
- the numerous sites and buildings particularly the SM in Castle Rising;
- the medieval settlement at Babingley which is Scheduled;
- the collection of Listed Buildings relating to the Railway Station at Wolferton;
- the Historic Park and Garden at Sandringham;
- the SM and Listed Building at the east end of Dersingham;
- the collection of Listed Buildings in Ingoldisthorpe and Snettisham supported by the Conservation Area in Snettisham;
- the wooded landscape and associated Listed Buildings in Ken Hill Wood;
- the Listed Buildings and Conservation Area in Heacham;
- the Listed Buildings and Conservation Area in Hunstanton;
- the Listed Buildings and Conservation Area in Old Hunstanton; and
- the Parks and Gardens of the Listed Hunstanton Hall.

Figure A2 Designated and Non-Designated Historic Environment Assets within the Norfolk Area of PDZ1 of the Wash SMP





Figure A3 Designated and Non-Designated Historic Environment Assets within PDZ2



Primary Analysis: a detailed assessment of PDZs

PDZ 1

As outlined above, an assessment for PDZ 1 on the historic environment has been provided for:

- The preferred policy of HTL for epoch 1;
- An alternative of MR for epoch 1;
- A policy option of HTL for epoch 2 and 3; and
- A policy option of MR for epoch 2 and 3.

Epoch 1

Preferred Policy

The preferred policy option of HTL was only considered to have one adverse effect during this epoch, namely the effects on coastal processes, together with the subsequent increased erosion of any archaeological sites or structures on the foreshore, in particular those in the table below, which comprise 27 locally important and one nationally (as part of a group) important non-designated heritage assets (nationally important sites are shown in **bold**).

The scale of any increase in erosion is considered to be negligible since The Wash has been defended for a long period of time and the form of The Wash, as seen today, has developed in response to the provision of defence.

Sites and structures along the current defence line would also experience a negligible increase in erosion. However, they would potentially be at risk of disturbance during any further coastal management works. The sites that could be disturbed are all post-medieval or modern sea defences and are locally important sites, as listed below.

In terms of flooding, this policy would retain the existing level of flood risk, and hence no increase in likely flooding and its subsequent potential effects on the 127 locally important, 2 regionally important, and 124 nationally important but non-designated heritage assets, as well as 20 listed buildings, 3 Scheduled Monuments, and one Conservation Area (see **Annex A3**).

No changes would occur to historic landscape features, and therefore no alteration to the historic landscape character would occur as a result of SMP policy.

Overall, the HTL policy is a continuation of existing shoreline management in this PDZ, which currently holds the line via a system of private and public sea defences. Overall, this policy scores minor negative in terms of disturbance and possible effects of erosion on a number of locally and regionally important heritage assets, and minor positive in terms of maintaining the standard of flood protection to a very large number (253) of non-designated sites and 24 designated sites or areas.

On balance the policy is considered to have a minor positive effect overall.

Alternative Policy Option

The alternative, MR, policy along this frontage results in a range of potential negative effects on the historic environment, not least the disturbance to sites that may occur at the new defence line during its construction, but also due to the increased flooding to sites between the new defence line and the current defence line. The effect of a long term increase in flooding would be dependent on a number of factors including the frequency of the flooding and the location of the realigned defences. If frequency is low, then the possible rate of deterioration of archaeological sites and historic buildings would low. However, erosion could

potentially increase in a MR scenario particularly along the line of the current defences, and any breach locations. Overall, MR would result in an increase in the rate of deterioration of historic environment assets from flooding, an increase in the rate of erosion at some sites, and also a change in the historic landscape character, by reverting areas of 18th, 19th and 20th Century drainage and enclosure to a more natural system that would over time erode the historic landscape character features of the areas between the realigned defences and the current defences, albeit over a very long timescale. This policy would result in potential major negative impact arising from increased flooding and erosion.

Epochs 2 and 3

The uncertainty relating to how the morphology of The Wash will respond to climate change and coastal policy has prevented the SMP from offering a single preferred policy in this area. It follows therefore, that the effects of either option offered (MR or HTL) are subject to those same uncertainties. Equally, it must be stressed that the SMP advocates the selection of the preferred policy based on a determination of the observed shifts in The Wash over time. The assessment for both options must, therefore, be considered indicative and subject to future more informed consideration as the effects of the plan and sea level rise are monitored.,

In the long term, the beneficial effects associated with HTL would remain, whilst the potential adverse impacts of erosion would be reduced in likelihood (as HTL would be selected if there was accretion of the intertidal habitats). However, overall, the minor positive and some minor negative impacts as described in epoch 1 would remain with, on balance, a minor positive effect.

In the long term, the adverse effects associated with MR as described for epoch 1 would be increased, whereby the likelihood and extent of erosion would increase and consequently, the potential loss or disturbance to heritage assets and historic landscape character would therefore be more pronounced. Consequently, the major negative impacts identified for epoch 1 would remain.

PDZ 2

In the same way that PDZ1 was assessed, an assessment for PDZ 2 on the historic environment has been provided for:

- The preferred policy of HTL for epochs 1, 2 and 3; and
- An alternative of MR for epochs 1, 2 and 3.

Epochs 1, 2 and 3

Preferred Policy

The effects of the preferred policy option were similar to those of PDZ1. The HTL policy provides ongoing defence for coastal communities, but will prevent coastal processes from developing naturally. In relation to the historic environment, the preferred policy option of HTL will have an adverse effect on the intent to allow

coastal processes to develop naturally, and could result in increased erosion of any archaeological sites or structures along the foreshore which is expected to affect 12 locally important and 2 regionally important non-designated sites, which are listed as follows (regionally important sites are highlighted in **bold**):

The scale of any increase in erosion in epoch 1 is considered to be negligible since The Wash and this section of coastline has been defended for a long period of time and the form of coastline, as seen today, has developed in response to the actual provision of defence. However, in epochs 2 and 3 the potential scale of erosion to these sites would increase with a greater likelihood that the heritage assets listed above would be disturbed and deteriorate to the point where in the long-term they would be destroyed.

Sites and structures along the current defence line would also experience a negligible increase in erosion; however, they would potentially be at risk of disturbance during any further coastal management works through epochs 1, 2 and 3. The sites that could be disturbed are mostly post-medieval or modern in date and locally or regionally important, as listed below (regionally important site is highlighted in **bold**):

In terms of flooding, this policy would retain the existing level of flood risk, and hence no increase in likely flooding and its subsequent potential effects on 119 locally important, 8 regionally important, and 2 nationally important but non-designated heritage assets, as well as 5 listed buildings, 2 Scheduled Monuments, and 2 Conservation Areas (see **Annex A3**) would occur throughout epochs 1, 2 and 3.

No changes would occur to historic landscape features, and therefore no alteration to the historic landscape character would occur as a result of SMP policy.

Overall, the HTL policy is a continuation of existing shoreline management in this PDZ, which holds the line via a system of private and public sea defences. Overall, this policy would result in a minor negative impact resulting from disturbance and possible effects of erosion (due to the negligible increases and the likely investigations that would be carried out), and a major positive impact in terms of maintaining the standard of flood protection to a very large number (129) of non-designated sites and 9 designated sites or areas (5 Listed Buildings, 2 Scheduled Monuments, and two Conservation Areas). On balance this policy is considered to have a minor positive impact.

Alternative Policy Option

The alternative, MR, policy along this frontage results in a range of potential adverse effects on the historic environment, not least the loss of sites that would occur as the shingle ridge rolls back following managed realignment of the defence line particularly during the 2nd and 3rd epochs, with the increasing likelihood of a breach occurring. Consequently, limited disturbance is expected on those sites that are along or immediately behind the current defence line during epoch 1 as a result of MR. This policy would result in a greater level of deterioration of a larger number of the sites along the defence line than the preferred policy particularly in epochs 2 and 3. Deterioration would be expected to the locally and regionally important sites (regionally important site is highlighted in **bold**).

In addition, the realigned defences could potentially impact on existing or currently unidentified (buried) heritage assets in the hinterland. Currently the specific sites affected cannot be determined until a realigned defence line is identified. However, there are no designated heritage assets seaward of the dismantled King's Lynn to Snettisham/Hunstanton Railway Line within this PDZ, and any managed realignment is not expected to progress further landward than this feature due to the topography rising inland of this feature. Consequently, any potential MR is not likely to result in any greater than a minor negative impact on heritage assets.

Historic landscape character will mainly remain unchanged, though some potential deterioration in man made features (sea defences and WWII structures) may result in minor and localised visual disturbance to these features, with minor degradation to the historic landscape character, resulting in a minor negative impact.

PDZ 3

Epochs 1, 2 and 3

Preferred Policy

The preferred policy option of HTL was only considered to have one adverse effect during all epochs, namely the effects on coastal processes and the subsequent increased erosion of any archaeological sites or structures on the foreshore, in particular the following locally and regionally important heritage assets (regionally important site is highlighted in bold):

Over the three epochs it is likely that the WWII sites and structures will themselves be lost. As all these sites are locally important the significance of the impact would be minor negative.

Sites and structures along the current defence line would potentially be at risk of disturbance during any further coastal management works and improvements to current defences. However, it is expected that only limited areas of these sites may be affected, and appropriate investigation, recording and design would minimise the scale of disturbance to the following sites, such that a minor negative impact would be expected, and the remaining extent of these sites would be protected. The locally and regionally important sites that could be affected are as follows (regionally important site is highlighted in bold italics and the nationally important site is highlighted in **bold**).

Without protection areas of the Hunstanton Conservation Area would be eroded, though this is protected with the preferred policy, there is the potential for disturbance to the visual setting of the Conservation Area depending on any potential scheme design. Sensitive design should avoid or minimise any disturbance and as such limited alteration to historic landscape character would occur and consequently no impact is anticipated as a result of this preferred SMP policy.

In terms of flooding, this policy would retain the existing level of flood risk, and hence no increase in likely flooding and its subsequent potential effects on part of site MNF 1145 (see **Annex A3**) within the flood zone would occur. Furthermore, the HTL policy would prevent the erosion of the following locally important heritage assets (regionally important site is highlighted in ***bold italics*** and the nationally important site is highlighted in **bold**).

Overall, the HTL policy is a continuation of existing shoreline management in this PDZ, and results in a potential minor negative impact as a result of disturbance and possible effects of erosion from the maintenance of defences, but overall a minor positive impact as a result of maintaining the standard of flood protection to 5 locally and regionally important non-designated heritage assets and part of Hunstanton Conservation Area (nationally important).

PDZ 4

Epochs 1, 2 and 3

Preferred Policy

The policy of NAI for three epochs is based on the intent to allow the cliffs to erode naturally, continue to provide their defence function (expected to be beyond the lifetime of the plan in epoch 3) and through erosion - supply sediment to the beach at Hunstanton.

This policy would result in no additional erosion along the foreshore and the sites that are currently preserved or recorded there, due to the potential sourcing of material for the beach from the eroding cliff.

The erosion of the cliff line will result in the loss of 9 locally important heritage assets by the end of epoch 3, most of which are of modern or post-medieval date with the exception of a possible stretch of a feature that is either a post-medieval bank or possible Roman road. Within epoch 3 the lighthouse (which is a Grade II Listed Building) would also be lost, and St Edmund's Chapel (a Grade II Listed Building) could be at risk due to its proximity to the erosion line by the end of epoch 3. Furthermore, a large open area of the Hunstanton Conservation Area would also be lost through erosion over time. These losses would result in a potential major negative impact on the historic environment. The sites that would be affected are as follows (nationally important heritage assets are identified in **bold**).

The erosion of the notable historic landscape elements of the 2 Listed Buildings and part of the Conservation Area is of significant scale in terms of the PDZ and also significant in terms of the value of the features lost. Since this policy does not represent a change in current management, a minor negative impact could arise due to the loss of these valuable historic landscape features within this PDZ. Proposed mitigation measures should be determined in discussion with English Heritage and the Local Authority Archaeologist, and could range from recording of the Listed Buildings as a minimum measure, up to relocation of the structures further inland.

Alternative Policy Option:

A HTL policy has also been appraised for epoch 3, as this policy would be implemented should erosion risk threaten the properties or infrastructure located above Hunstanton Cliffs (the minor negative impact identified above would therefore be avoided). On the whole, a HTL policy at the cliff would protect the Listed Buildings from destruction, and would avoid further losses to the Conservation Area that might arise during epochs 1 and 2.

In terms of the effect on historic landscape character, the loss of a part of Hunstanton Conservation Area, which is predominantly open ground would be expected to constitute a minor negative impact on the historic landscape character as the key features (such as the Listed Buildings) would remain protected.

The protection and preservation of the two listed buildings and part of Hunstanton Conservation Area, due to a new management direction, would be a major positive impact.
